- *Trade and manufacturing city
- * Worship of Apollo
- * **Corporate guilds** of tailors, wool workers, potters, tanners, dyers (especially purple dye), leather-workers, bronze-smiths, and also slave trade...

The least significant of the 7 churches and the longest letter

Revelation 2:18-28

To the angel (or Messenger) of the church in Thyatira

From: words of the Son of God, who has eyes like a flame of fire, and whose feet are like burnished bronze:

Revelation 1:14b-15a

His head and his hair were white as white wool, white as snow; his eyes were like a flame of fire,
 his feet were like burnished bronze, refined as in a furnace and his voice was like the sound of many waters

Daniel 10:6

⁶...his face like lightning, his eyes like flaming torches, his arms and legs like the gleam of burnished bronze, and the sound of his words like the roar of a multitude.

I know your works... (v.19)

- * your love, faith, service, and patient endurance.
- * your last works are greater than the first

This against you... (vv. 20-21)

You tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophet and is teaching and beguiling my servants to practice fornication and to eat food sacrificed to idols.

²¹ I gave her time to repent, but she refuses to repent of her fornication.

Who was Jezebel...

- 1. Actual person named Jezebel false prophet?
- 2. General false prophets leading people astray?

Jezebel in 1 & 2 King: wife of King Ahab, who killed many of God's prophets and made people worship Baal.

Tolerate (According to Merriam-Webster)

- 1. to allow to be or to be done without prohibition, hindrance, or contradiction
- 1b. to put up with
- 2. to endure or resist the action of (as drug or food) without serious side effects or discomfort

22-23 Beware,

- I am throwing into great distress ... unless they repent of her doings;

- I will strike her children dead.

And all the churches will know that I am the one who searches minds and hearts, and I will give to each of you as your works deserve.

What was Jesus asking them to do? (v.24)

- to the rest of you in Thyatira, who do not hold this teaching, who have not learned what some call 'the deep things of Satan,'

- I do not lay on you any other burden; ²⁵ only hold fast to what you have until I come.

To everyone who conquers...

- 1. I will give authority over the nations
- 2. I will also give the morning star

²⁹ Let anyone who has an ear listen to what the Spirit is saying to the churches.
